
#### **BRASIL**

Após o uso, as pilhas e/ou baterias deverão ser entregues ao estabelecimento comercial ou rede de assistência técnica autorizada.

Cobrir os terminais positivo (+) e negativo (-) com uma fita isolante adesiva, antes de depositar numa caixa destinada para o recolhimento. O contato entre partes metálicas pode causar vazamentos, gerar calor, romper a blindagem e produzir fogo. (Fig. 1)

#### Como isolar os terminais




Não desmonte, não remova o invólucro, nem amasse a bateria. O gás liberado pela bateria pode irritar a garganta, danificar o lacre do invólucro ou o vazamento provocar calor, ruptura da blindagem e produzir fogo devido ao curto circuito dos terminais. Não incinere nem aqueça as baterias, elas não podem ficar expostas a temperaturas superiores a 100 °C (212 °F). O gás liberado pela bateria pode irritar a garganta, danificar o lacre do invólucro ou o vazamento provocar calor, ruptura da blindagem e produzir fogo devido ao curto circuito dos terminais provocado internamente.



If the power cord is used while damaged, electric shocks, short-circuits or fire will result.

• Do not damage the power cord, make any modifications to it, place it near any hot objects, bend it excessively, twist it, pull it, place heavy objects on top of it or wrap it into a bundle.

Ask an Authorized Service Center to carry out any repairs to the power cord that might be necessary.

# Completely insert the power plug into the wall outlet and the power connector into the projector terminal.

If the plug is not inserted correctly, electric shocks or overheating will result.

• Do not use plugs which are damaged or wall outlets which are coming loose from the wall.

#### Do not use anything other than the provided power cord.

Failure to observe this will result in electric shocks or fire. Please note that if you do not use the provided power cord to ground the device on the side of the outlet, this may result in electric shocks.

#### Clean the power plug regularly to prevent it from becoming covered in dust.

Failure to observe this will cause a fire.

- If dust builds up on the power plug, the resulting humidity can damage the insulation.
- If not using the projector for an extended period of time, pull the power plug out from the wall outlet.

Pull the power plug out from the wall outlet and wipe it with a dry cloth regularly.

## Do not handle the power plug and power connector with wet hands.

Failure to observe this will result in electric shocks.

#### Do not overload the wall outlet.

If the power supply is overloaded (ex., by using too many adapters), overheating may occur and fire will result.

#### ■ ON USE/INSTALLATION

#### Do not place the projector on soft materials such as carpets or sponge mats.

Doing so will cause the projector to overheat, which can cause burns, fire or damage to the projector.

# Do not set up the projector in humid or dusty places or in places where the projector may come into contact with oily smoke or steam.

Using the projector under such conditions will result in fire, electric shocks or deterioration of components. Deterioration of components (such as ceiling mount brackets) may cause the projector which is mounted on the ceiling to fall down.

# Do not install this projector in a place which is not strong enough to take the full weight of the projector or on top of a surface which is sloped or unstable.

Failure to observe this will cause projector to fall down or tip over the projector, and severe injury or damage could result.

#### **WARNING:**

#### Do not cover the air intake/exhaust ports.

Doing so will cause the projector to overheat, which can cause fire or damage to the projector.

- Do not place the projector in narrow, badly ventilated places.
- Do not place the projector on cloth or papers, as these materials could be drawn into the air intake port.
- Provide at least 1 m (40") of space between any walls or objects and the exhaust port, and at least 50 cm (20") of space between any walls or objects and the intake port.

## Do not place your hands or other objects close to the air exhaust port.

Doing so will cause burns or damage your hands or other objects.

• Heated air comes out of the air exhaust port. Do not place your hands or face, or objects which cannot withstand heat close to this port.

# Do not look at or place your skin into the light emitted from the lens while the projector is being used. Doing so can cause burns or loss of sight.

- Strong light is emitted from the projector's lens. Do not look at or place your hands directly into this light.
- Be especially careful not to let young children look into the lens. In addition, turn off the power and switch off the main power when you are away from the projector.

#### Never attempt to remodel or disassemble the projector.

High voltages can cause fire or electric shocks.

For any inspection, adjustment and repair work, please contact an Authorized Service Center.

## Do not project an image with the lens cover attached.

Doing so can cause fire.

# Do not allow metal objects, flammable objects, or liquids to enter inside of the projector. Do not allow the projector to get wet.

Doing so may cause short circuits or overheating, and result in fire, electric shock, or malfunction of the projector.

- Do not place containers of liquid or metal objects near the projector.
- If liquid enters inside of the projector, consult your dealer.
- Particular attention must be paid to children.

### Use the ceiling mount bracket specified by Panasonic Connect Co., Ltd.

Using the ceiling mount bracket other than the specified one will result in falling accidents.

• Attach the supplied safety cable to the ceiling mount bracket to prevent the projector from falling down.

# Installation work (such as ceiling mount bracket) should only be carried out by a qualified technician. If installation is not carried out and secured correctly, it can cause injury or accidents, such as electric shocks.

• Be sure to use the wire provided with the ceiling mount bracket as an extra safety measure to prevent the projector from falling down. (Install in a different location to the ceiling mount bracket.)

#### **WARNING:**

#### **■** ACCESSORIES

#### Do not use or handle the batteries improperly, and refer to the following.

Failure to observe this will cause burns, batteries to leak, overheat, explode or catch fire.

- Do not use unspecified batteries.
- Do not use chargeable batteries.
- Do not disassemble dry cell batteries.
- Do not heat the batteries or place them into water or fire.
- Do not allow the + and terminals of the batteries to come into contact with metallic objects such as necklaces or hairpins.
- Do not store or carry batteries together with metallic objects.
- Store the batteries in a plastic bag and keep them away from metallic objects.
- Make sure the polarities (+ and –) are correct when inserting the batteries.

#### Always disconnect all cables before moving the projector.

# When mounting the projector on the ceiling, keep mounting screws and power cord from contact with metal parts inside the ceiling.

Contact with metal parts inside the ceiling can cause electric shocks.

## Never plug headphones and earphones into <VARIABLE AUDIO OUT> terminal.

Excessive sound pressure from earphones and headphones can cause hearing loss.


# Chapter 1 Preparation

This chapter describes things you need to know or check before using the projector.

## Precautions for use

## Lens cushion

• In order to protect the projection lens from the vibration during transportation, lens cushion is attached to the product at the time of purchase. Please remove the lens cushion before use.



## **Cautions when transporting**

- When transporting the projector, hold it securely by its bottom and avoid excessive vibration and impacts. They may damage the internal components and result in malfunctions.
- Do not transport the projector with the adjustable feet extended. Doing so may damage the adjustable feet.
- Do not move or transport the projector with the wireless module (Model No.: ET-WML100) of the optional accessories attached. Doing so may damage the wireless module.

## Cautions when installing

## ■ Do not set up the projector outdoors.

The projector is designed for indoor use only.

## ■ Do not set up the projector in the following locations.

- Places where vibration and impacts occur such as in a car or vehicle: Doing so may cause damage to internal components or malfunction.
- Locations near the sea or areas affected by corrosive gas: Corrosion may damage internal components or cause the projector to malfunction.
- Near the exhaust of an air conditioner: Depending on the conditions of use, the screen may fluctuate in rare
  cases due to the heated air from the air exhaust port or the hot or cooled air. Make sure that the exhaust
  from the projector or other equipment, or the air from the air conditioner does not blow toward the front of the
  projector.
- Near high-voltage power lines or near motors: Doing so may interfere with the operation of the projector.
- Places with sharp temperature fluctuations such as near lights (studio lamps): Doing so may shorten the life of the lamp, or result in deformation of the outer case due to heat, which may cause malfunctions.
   Follow the operating environment temperature of the projector.

# ■ Be sure to ask a specialized technician or your dealer when installing the projector on a ceiling.

The optional Ceiling Mount Bracket is required. Be sure to use the Projector Mount Bracket together with the ceiling mount bracket for high ceilings or low ceilings.

# ■ Ask a qualified technician or your dealer to install the cable wiring for DIGITAL LINK connection.

Image and sound may be disrupted if cable transmission characteristics cannot be obtained due to inadequate installation.

# ■ The projector may not work properly due to strong radio waves from the broadcast station or the radio.

If there is any facility or equipment, which outputs strong radio waves, near the installation location, install the projector at a location sufficiently far from the source of the radio waves. Or, wrap the LAN cable connected to the <DIGITAL LINK/LAN> terminal by using a piece of metal foil or a metal pipe which is grounded at both ends.

## ■ Focus adjustment

The projection lens is thermally affected by the light from the light source, making the focus unstable in the period just after switching on the power. It is recommended that images be projected continuously for at least 30 minutes before the focus is adjusted.

## ■ Do not install the projector at elevations of 2 700 m (8 858') or higher above sea level.


# ■ Do not use the projector in a location that the ambient temperature exceeds 40 °C (104 °F).

Using the projector in a location that the altitude is too high or the ambient temperature is too high may reduce the life of the components or result in malfunctions.

The upper limit of the operating environment temperature should be between 0 °C (32 °F) and 40 °C (104 °F) when using it at elevations lower than 1 400 m (4 593') above sea level, and between 0 °C (32 °F) and 35 °C (95 °F) when using it at high altitudes (between 1 400 m (4 593') and 2 700 m (8 858') above sea level).

## ■ Do not use the projector vertically or tilted to the right or the left.

• Do not use the projector tilted at an angle that exceeds ±30° from the vertical plane or ±15° from the horizontal plane. It may reduce the life of the components.




#### ■ Cautions when setting up the projector

- Use the adjustable feet only for the floor standing installation and for adjusting the angle. Using them for other purposes may damage the projector.
- When installing and using the projector with a method other than the floor standing installation using the adjustable feet or the ceiling mount, please fix the projector by using the four screw holes with "M6" mark for ceiling mount (as shown in the figure).

(Screw diameter: M6, tapping depth inside the set: 12 mm (15/32"), torque:  $4 \pm 0.5 \text{ N} \cdot \text{m}$ ) Also at that time, make sure that there is no clearance between the screw holes for ceiling mount on the projector bottom and the setting surface by inserting spacers (metallic) between them.


When using the existing ceiling mount bracket (for high ceilings) ET-PKF110H or the existing ceiling mount bracket (for low ceilings) ET-PKF110S, you can use the four screw holes with "M4" mark (as shown in the figure), but do not use these holes for other than ceiling mount. (▶ page 156)

(Screw diameter: M4, tapping depth inside the set: 8 mm (5/16"), torque:  $1.25 \pm 0.2 \text{ N} \cdot \text{m}$ ) In addition, do not mix the M4 and M6 screw holes for installation.



The positions of screw holes for ceiling mount and adjustable feet

- Do not stack projectors on top of each other.
- Do not use the projector supporting it by the top.
- Do not block the ventilation ports (intake and exhaust) of the projector.
- Prevent hot and cool air from the air conditioning system to blow directly to the ventilation ports (intake and exhaust) of the projector.



• Do not install the projector in a confined space.

When installing the projector in a confined space, provide air conditioning or ventilation separately. Exhaust heat may accumulate when the ventilation is not enough, triggering the protection circuit of the projector.

## **Security**

When using this product, take safety measures against the following incidents.

## **DIGITAL LINK**

"DIGITAL LINK" is a technology to transmit the video, audio, Ethernet, and serial control signals using a twisted pair cable by adding unique functions by Panasonic Connect Co., Ltd. to the HDBaseT™ communication standard formulated by HDBaseT Alliance.

This projector supports the optional DIGITAL LINK output supported device (Model No.: ET-YFB100G, ET-YFB200G) and peripheral devices by other manufacturers (twisted-pair-cable transmitters such as the "XTP transmitter" of Extron Electronics) that use the same HDBaseT™ standard. For the devices of other manufacturers that the operation has been verified with this projector, refer to website (https://panasonic.net/cns/projector/). Note that the verification for devices of other manufacturers has been made

for the items set by Panasonic Connect Co., Ltd., and not all the operations have been verified. For operation or performance problems caused by the devices of other manufacturers, contact the respective manufacturers.

## **Notes on Using Wireless Connection**

Wireless connection function of the projector uses radio waves in the 2.4 GHz band.

A radio station license is not required, but be sure to read and fully understand the following items before use. The wireless module (Model No.: ET-WML100) of optional accessories must be installed when you want to use the wireless LAN function of this projector.

## ■ Do not use near other wireless equipment.

The following equipment may use radio waves in the same band as the projector.

When the projector is used near these devices, radio wave interference may make communication impossible, or the communication speed may become slower.

- Microwave ovens, etc.
- Industrial, chemical and medical equipment, etc.
- In-plant radio stations for identifying moving objects such as those used in factory manufacturing lines, etc.
- Designated low-power radio stations.

## ■ If at all possible, avoid the use of cellular phones, TV sets or radios near the projector.

Cellular phones, TV sets, radios and similar devices use different radio bands from the projector, so there is no effect on wireless communication or the transmission and reception of these devices. However, radio waves from the projector may produce audio or video noise.

# ■ Wireless communication radio waves cannot penetrate steel reinforcements, metal, concrete, etc.

Communication is possible through walls and floors made from materials such as wood and glass (except glass containing wire mesh), but not through walls and floors made from steel reinforcements, metal, concrete, etc.

## ■ Avoid using the projector in locations prone to static electricity.

If the projector is used in a location prone to static electricity, such as on a carpet, the wireless LAN or wired LAN connection may be lost.

If the static electricity or noise make it impossible to establish a connection with the LAN, please press the power button on the remote control or the control panel to power off the projector, and eliminate the source of static electricity or noise, then turn on the projector.

#### ■ Using the projector outside the country

Note that depending on countries or regions there are restrictions on the channels and frequencies at which you can use the wireless LAN.

<sup>\*</sup>Please use the wireless LAN feature in compliance with the laws of each country.

#### **About Wireless LANs**

The advantage of a wireless LAN is that information can be exchanged between a PC or other such equipment and an access point using radio waves as long as you are within range for radio transmissions.

On the other hand, because the radio waves can travel through obstacles (such as walls) and are available everywhere within a given range, problems of the type listed below may occur if security-related settings are not made.

- A malicious third-part may intentionally intercept and monitor transmitted data including the content of e-mail and personal information such as your ID, password, and/or credit card numbers.
- A malicious third-party may access your personal or corporate network without authorization and engage in the following types of behavior.

Retrieve personal and/or secret information (information leak)

Spread false information by impersonating a particular person (spoofing)

## **Early Warning Software**

The projector supports "Early Warning Software", which monitors the status of the display (projector and flat panel display) and the peripheral devices inside an intranet, and notifies of abnormality of such equipment and detects signs of possible abnormality. Also, maintenance can be performed in advance, because this software gives notification of approximate time to replace consumables of the display, to clean each part of the display, and to replace the components of the display.

Depending on the type of license, the number of displays that can be registered for monitoring varies. Limited to the first 90 days after installation in a computer, it is possible to register up to 2048 units of displays free of charge. Download the software from website (https://panasonic.net/cns/projector/pass/). It is necessary to register and login to PASS<sup>\*1</sup> to download.

## Cautions on use

#### ■ To get a good picture quality

• In order to view a beautiful image in higher contrast, prepare an appropriate environment. Draw curtains or blinds over windows and turn off any lights near the screen to prevent outside light or light from indoor lamps from shining onto the screen.

## ■ Do not touch the surface of the projection lens with your bare hands.

If the surface of the projection lens becomes dirty from fingerprints or anything else, this will be magnified and projected onto the screen.

Please keep in mounting the supplied lens cover when you do not use the projector.

## **■** LCD panel

• The LCD panel is precision-made. Note that in rare cases, pixels of high precision could be missing or always lit. Note that such phenomena do not indicate malfunction. If still images are projected for a long time, a residual image may remain on the LCD panel. Note that the residual image may not disappear.

## **■** Optical parts

When the operating environment temperature is high or in environments where lots of dust, cigarette smoke, etc. is present, the replacement cycle of the LCD panel, polarizing plates and other optical parts may be shorter even if used for less than one year. Consult your dealer for details.

## ■ Do not move the projector or subject it to vibration or impact while it is operating.

Doing so may shorten the life of the built-in motor.

## ■ Lamp

The light source of the projector is a high-pressure mercury lamp.

A high-pressure mercury lamp has the following characteristics.

- The luminance of the lamp will decrease by duration of usage.
- The lamp may burst with a loud sound or have its service life shortened because of shock, chipping, or degradation due to cumulative runtime.
- The lamp life varies greatly depending on individual differences and usage conditions. In particular, continuous use for 12 hours or more and frequent off/on switching of the power greatly deteriorate the lamp and affects the lamp life.
- In rare cases, the lamp bursts shortly after projection starts.
- The risk of bursting increases when the lamp is used beyond its replacement cycle. Make sure to replace the lamp unit regularly.

("When to replace the lamp unit" (→ page 137), "How to replace the lamp unit" (→ page 138))

- If the lamp bursts, gas contained inside of the lamp is released in the form of smoke.
- It is recommended that you store the Replacement lamp unit as a contingency.

### ■ Computer and external device connections

• When connecting a computer or an external device, read this manual carefully regarding the use of power cords and shielded cables as well.

## **Storage**

When storing the projector, keep it in a dry room.

## Disposal

To dispose of the product, ask your local authorities or dealer for correct methods of disposal.

The lamp contains mercury. When disposing of used lamp units, contact your local authorities or dealer for correct methods of disposal.

  a distance approx. 30 m (98'5") or shorter from the remote control signal receiver. The remote control can control at angles of up to ±30°
  vertically and horizontally, but the effective control range may be reduced.
- If there are any obstacles between the remote control and the remote control signal receiver, the remote control may not operate properly.
- The signal will be reflected off the screen. However, the operating range may be limited from light reflection loss due to the screen material.
- If the remote control signal receiver directly receives strong light, such as fluorescent light, the remote control may not operate properly. Use it in a place distant from the light source.
- The power indicator <ON(G)/STANDBY(R)> will blink if the projector receives a remote control signal.



## When using the system with multiple projectors

When you use the system with multiple projectors, you can operate all the projectors simultaneously or each projector individually by using single remote control, if a unique ID number is assigned to each projector. When you want to set the ID number, at first you need to complete the Initial setting, and then after setting the ID number of the projector, set the ID number on the remote control.

About Initial setting, please refer to "When the initial setting screen is displayed" (▶ page 45).

The factory default ID number of the unit (the projector and the remote control) is set to [ALL], you can control with this setting. If necessary, please set the ID number to the remote control and the projector.

About how to set the ID number of the remote control, please refer to "Setting the ID number of the remote control" (→ page 57).

Set the ID number of the projector from the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu → [PROJECTOR ID] (→ page 89).




This chapter describes things you need to do before using the projector such as the setup and connections.

## Setting up

## **Installation mode**

There are four ways to set up the projector. Set the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu  $\rightarrow$  [PROJECTION METHOD] ( $\Rightarrow$  page 90) depending on the installation method.






## Note

The projector has a built-in angle sensor. When projecting in front of the screen, if set the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu
 → [PROJECTION METHOD] → [AUTO], the projector's posture will be detected automatically. When projecting from
 rear, please set the [PROJECTION METHOD] to [REAR/DESK] or [REAR/CEILING].

#### ■ Angle sensor

The range of installation posture detected by the projector's built-in angle sensor is as follows.

In case of [AUTO], when the projector is placed with the top side upward within ±30° from the horizontal plane, it will switch to [FRONT/DESK] automatically; when the projector is placed with the top side downward within ±30° from the horizontal plane, it will switch to [FRONT/CEILING] automatically. Although it is detected as [FRONT/DESK] even when it exceeds ±30° with respect to the horizontal plane, do not use such installation posture in this range.



## <u>Attention</u>

<sup>•</sup> The angle sensor cannot detect whether it is the "Installation prohibited posture" in the above picture. Please do not use the projector tilted at an angle that exceeds ±30° from the vertical plane. It may reduce the life of the components. (▶ page 20)

## Parts for ceiling mount (optional)

The projector can be installed on the ceiling by combining the optional Ceiling Mount Bracket (Model No.: ET-PKD120H (for High Ceilings), ET-PKD120S (for Low Ceilings)) and ET-PKE301B (Projector Mount Bracket).


- Be sure to use the Ceiling Mount Bracket specified for this projector.
- Refer to the Installation Instructions supplied with the Ceiling Mount Bracket when installing the projector with the bracket.

#### **Attention**

• To ensure projector performance and security, installation of the Ceiling Mount Bracket must be carried out by your dealer or a qualified technician.

## Projected image and throw distance

Refer to the screen size and projection distances to install the projector. Image size and image position can be adjusted in accordance with the screen size and screen position.





## **Projection distance formulas**

To use a screen size not listed in this manual, check the screen size SD (m) and use the respective formula to calculate projection distance.

The unit of all the formulae is m. (Values obtained by the following calculation formulae contain a slight error.) When calculating a projection distance using image size designation (value in inches), multiply the value in inches by 0.0254 and substitute it into SD in the formula for calculating the projection distance.

## Adjusting adjustable feet

Install the projector on a flat surface so that the front of the projector is parallel to the screen surface and the projected image is rectangular.

If the screen is tilted downward, the projected image can be adjusted to be rectangular by adjusting the front adjustable feet. The adjustable feet can also be used to adjust the projector to be level when it is tilted in the horizontal direction.

Extend the adjustable feet by rotating in the direction shown in the figure and retract by rotating in the opposite direction.

# Connecting

## Before connecting

- Before connecting, carefully read the operating instructions for the external device to be connected.
- Turn off the power of all devices before connecting cables.
- Take note of the following points before connecting the cables. Failure to do so may result in malfunctions.
  - When connecting a cable to a device connected to the projector or the projector itself, touch any nearby metallic objects to eliminate static electricity from your body before performing work.
  - Do not use unnecessarily long cables to connect a device to the projector or to the projector body. The longer
    the cable, the more susceptible to noise it becomes. Since using a cable while it is wound makes it act like an
    antenna, it is more susceptible to noise.
  - When connecting cables, connect GND first, then insert the connecting terminal of the connecting device in a straight manner.
- Acquire any connection cable necessary to connect the external device to the system that is neither supplied with the device nor available as an option.
- If video signals from video equipment contain too much jitter, the images on the screen may wobble. In this case, a time base corrector (TBC) must be connected.
- The projector accepts video signals, Y/C signals, YC<sub>B</sub>C<sub>R</sub>/YP<sub>B</sub>P<sub>R</sub> signals, analog RGB signals (synchronization signals are TTL level), and digital signals.
- Some computer models or graphics cards are not compatible with the projector.
- Use a cable compensator when you connect devices to the projector using long cables. Otherwise the image may not display properly.
- Refer to "List of compatible signals" (→ page 151) for the types of video signals that can be used with the projector.





- · Always use one of the following when connecting a VCR.
  - A VCR with built-in time base corrector (TBC)
  - A time base corrector (TBC) between the projector and the VCR
- If nonstandard burst signals are connected, the image may be distorted. In such case, connect the time base corrector (TBC) between the
  projector and the external devices.

- For an HDMI cable, use an HDMI High Speed cable that conforms to HDMI standards. If a cable that does not conform to HDMI standards is used, images may be interrupted or may not be displayed.
- The <HDMI 1 IN> terminal/<HDMI 2 IN> terminal of the projector can be connected to an external device with a DVI-D terminal by using an HDMI/DVI conversion cable, but some devices may not project the image properly or function properly.
- The projector does not support VIERA Link (HDMI).
- If the [AUDIO IN SELECT] settings are incorrect, the projector may have malfunctions such as the absence of audio.
- When Y/C signals are input to the <COMPUTER 1 IN> terminal, switch the setting by using the [DISPLAY OPTION] menu → [COMPUTER IN/OUT] → [COMPUTER1 INPUT SETTING]. (→ page 79) In addition, When Y/C signals are input, please use the optional D-SUB S Video conversion cable (Model No.:ET-ADSV).

## **Connecting example: Computers**



## Attention


When connecting the projector to a computer or an external device, use the power cord supplied with each device and commercially
available shielded cables.

#### **Note**

- For an HDMI cable, use an HDMI High Speed cable that conforms to HDMI standards. If a cable that does not conform to HDMI standards is used, images may be interrupted or may not be displayed.
- The <hDMl 1 IN> terminal/<hDMl 2 IN> terminal of the projector can be connected to an external device with a DVI-D terminal by using an HDMl/DVI conversion cable, but some devices may not project the image properly or function properly.
- If you operate the projector using the computer with the resume feature (last memory), you may have to reset the resume feature to operate
  the projector.
- If the [AUDIO IN SELECT] settings are incorrect, the projector may have malfunctions such as the absence of audio.

## Connecting example using DIGITAL LINK

Twisted-pair-cable transmitters based on the communication standard HDBaseT<sup>™</sup> such as the optional DIGITAL LINK output supported device (Model No.: ET-YFB100G, ET-YFB200G) use twisted pair cables to transmit input images, Ethernet, and serial control signals, and the projector can input those digital signals to the <DIGITAL LINK/LAN> terminal.



\*1 The control target will be the projector or the twisted-pair-cable transmitter. The control itself may not be possible depending on the twisted-paircable transmitter. Check the operating instructions of the device to be connected.

#### **Attention**

- Always use one of the following when connecting a VCR.
  - A VCR with built-in time base corrector (TBC)
  - A time base corrector (TBC) between the projector and the VCR
- If nonstandard burst signals are connected, the image may be distorted. In such a case, connect the time base corrector (TBC) between the projector and the external devices.
- Ask a qualified technician or your dealer to install the cable wiring for a twisted-pair-cable transmitter and the projector. Image and sound may be disrupted if cable transmission characteristics cannot be obtained due to inadequate installation.
- For the LAN cable between the twisted-pair-cable transmitter and the projector, use a cable that meets the following criteria:
  - Compatible with CAT5e or higher
  - Shielded type (including connectors)
  - Straight-through
  - Single wire
- When laying cables between the twisted-pair-cable transmitter and the projector, check that cable characteristics are compatible with CAT5e
  or higher using tools such as a cable tester or cable analyzer.
   When a relay connector is used, include it in the measurement.
- Do not use a hub between the twisted-pair-cable transmitter and the projector.
- When connecting to the projector using a twisted-pair-cable transmitter (receiver) of other manufacturer, do not place another twisted-pair-cable transmitter between the twisted-pair-cable transmitter of other manufacturer and the projector. This may cause image and sound to be districted.
- Do not pull cables forcefully. In addition, do not bend or fold cables unnecessarily.
- To reduce the effects of noise as much as possible, stretch out the cables between the twisted-pair-cable transmitter and the projector without any loops.
- Lay the cables between a twisted-pair-cable transmitter and the projector away from other cables, particularly power cables.
- When laying multiple cables, run them side by side along the shortest distance possible without bundling them together.
- After laying the cables, confirm that the value of [SIGNAL QUALITY] in the [NETWORK] menu → [DIGITAL LINK STATUS] is displayed in
  green to indicate normal quality. (★ page 103)

- For an HDMI cable, use an HDMI High Speed cable that conforms to HDMI standards. If a cable that does not conform to HDMI standards is used, images may be interrupted or may not be displayed.
- The projector does not support VIERA Link (HDMI).
- The maximum transmission distance between the twisted-pair-cable transmitter and the projector is 100 m (328'1"). It is possible to transmit up to 150 m (492'2") if the twisted-pair-cable transmitter supports the long-reach communication method. If this distance is exceeded, image may be disrupted or a malfunction may occur in LAN communication. Please note that we do not support the use of the projector outside the maximum transmission distance. When connecting with the long reach, there may be a limitation to the video signal that can be transmitted or the distance depending on the specification of the twisted-pair-cable transmitter.
- For twisted-pair-cable transmitters of other manufacturers of which the operation has been verified with the projector, refer to the website (https://panasonic.net/cns/projector/). Note that the verification for devices of other manufacturers has been made for the items set by Panasonic Connect Co., Ltd., and not all the operations have been verified. For operation or performance problems caused by the devices of other manufacturers, contact the respective manufacturers.

# Switching on/off the projector

## Connecting the power cord


Make sure that the supplied power cord is securely fixed to the projector body to prevent it from being removed easily.

Confirm that the <MAIN POWER> switch is on the <OFF> side before connecting the power cord.

Use the power cord matching with the power supply voltage and the shape of the outlet.

For details of power cord handling, refer to "Read this first!" (→ page 4).

#### Attaching the power cord



1) Check the shapes of the <AC IN> terminal on the rear of the projector body and the power cord connector, and insert the plug completely in the correct direction (until you hear the side tabs click in place).


#### Removing the power cord



- 1) Confirm that the <MAIN POWER> switch on the rear of the projector body is on the <OFF> side, and remove the power plug from the outlet.
- 2) Remove the power cord connector from the <AC IN> terminal of the projector body while pressing the side tabs.

## Power indicator

Displays the status of the power. Check the status of the power indicator <ON(G)/STANDBY(R)> before operating the projector.


- \*1 The indicator flashes in the cycle: 2.75 seconds (light) → 0.25 seconds (off).

- \*3 The indicator flashes in the cycle: 0.5 seconds (light) → 0.5 seconds (off).

#### Note

- While the power indicator <ON(G)/STANDBY(R)> is lit in orange, the fan is running to cool the projector.
- For about 90 seconds after the projector is switched off and the luminous lamp cooling is started, the luminous lamp does not light up even if the power is switched on. After the power indicator <ON(G)/STANDBY(R)> lights or blinks in red, turn on the power again.
- The projector consumes power even in standby mode (power indicator <ON(G)/STANDBY(R)> lights or blinks in red). Refer to "Power consumption" (→ page 153) for the power consumption.
- The power indicator <ON(G)/STANDBY(R)> will blink if the projector receives a remote control signal.
- If the power indicator <ON(G)/STANDBY(R)> is blinking 3 times in red, consult your dealer.

## Switching on the projector

Before switching on the projector, make sure all the other devices are correctly connected (▶ page 38) and remove the lens cover first.



- 1) Connect the power cord to the projector body.
- 2) Connect the power plug to an outlet.
- Press the <ON> side of the <MAIN POWER> switch to turn on the power.
  - The power indicator <ON(G)/STANDBY(R)> lights or blinks in red, and the projector enters the standby mode.
- 4) Press the power  $\langle 0/| \rangle$  button.
  - The power indicator <ON(G)/STANDBY(R)> lights in green and the image is soon projected on the screen.

#### **Attention**

• Be sure to remove the lens cover before starting projection.

- If the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu → [ECO MANAGEMENT] → [STANDBY MODE] is set to [ECO], it may take approx. 10 seconds longer
  before the projector starts projecting after the power is turned on, compared with when [NORMAL] is set.
- If the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu → [ECO MANAGEMENT] → [STANDBY MODE] is set to [NORMAL], it may take approx. 1 minute to
  enable the network function after connecting the power cord.
- If the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu → [INITIAL STARTUP] is set to [LAST MEMORY] and the projector was turned off by using the circuit
  breaker directly while projecting during the last time of use, the power indicator <ON(G)/STANDBY(R)> will light in green a while after the
  circuit breaker is turned on, and then projection of the image will start.

## When the initial setting screen is displayed

When the projector is switched on for the first time after purchase as well as when [INITIALIZE ALL] in the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu is executed, the **[INITIAL SETTING]** screen is displayed. Set them in accordance with circumstances.

In other occasions, you can change the settings by menu operations.

If you press the <RETURN> button or the <MENU> button while the **[INITIAL SETTING]** screen is displayed, you can go back to the previous screen.

#### Note

• When the projector is used for the first time, in order to clearly display the menu screen, it is required to adjust the focus lever and the zoom lever. For details, refer to "Adjusting the image" (\*page 50).

## Initial setting (display language)

Select the language to show on the screen.

After the initial setting completed, you can change the display language from the [LANGUAGE] menu.

## 1) Press ▲▼◀▶ to select the display language.



#### 2) Press the <ENTER> button to proceed to the initial setting.

## **Initial setting (projector setting)**

Set each item.



#### Press ▲▼ to select an item.

Set the operation mode during standby. The default setting is [NORMAL], you can use the network function during standby. If you want to reduce the power consumption, it can be set to [ECO]. After the initial setting is completed, you can change the setting from the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu → [ECO MANAGEMENT] → [STANDBY MODE].

- 2) Press **♦** to switch the setting.
- 3) Press the <ENTER> button to proceed to the initial setting.

## Initial setting (time zone)

Set [TIME ZONE] according to the country or region where the projector is used.

After the initial setting completed, you can change the setting from the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu  $\rightarrow$  [DATE AND TIME]. The current settings are displayed in [LOCAL DATE] and [LOCAL TIME].

Press ▲▼ to switch the setting.



2) Press the <ENTER> button to proceed to the initial setting.

#### Note

By default, the time zone of the projector is set to +09:00 (Japan and Korean Standard Time). Change the setting in the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu → [DATE AND TIME] → [TIME ZONE] to the time zone of the region where you use the projector.

#### Initial setting (date and time)

Set the local date and time. After the initial setting is completed, you can change the setting from the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu  $\rightarrow$  [DATE AND TIME].

To set the date and time automatically, refer to "Setting the date and time automatically" (→ page 99).


Press ▲▼ to select an item.



- 2) Press **♦** to switch the setting.
- 3) Press the <ENTER> button.
  - Confirm the setting value and complete the initial setting.

## Making adjustments and selections

It is recommended that images be projected continuously for at least 30 minutes before the focus is adjusted.




- 1) Roughly adjust the focus of the image. (⇒ page 50)
- 2) Change the setting of the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu → [PROJECTION METHOD] depending on the installation mode. (→ page 33)
  - Refer to "Navigating through the menu" (→ page 59) for the operation of the menu screen.
- 3) Press the <INPUT SELECT> button on the control panel or the input selection (<HDMI1>, <HDMI2>, <DIGITAL LINK>, <COMPUTER 1/2>, <VIDEO>, <NETWORK>) buttons on the remote control to select the input signal.
- 4) Adjust the front, back and sideway tilt of the projector with the adjustable feet. (⇒ page 37)
- 5) Adjust the position of the image by the lens shift lever.
- 6) If the input signal is the RGB signal, press the <AUTO SETUP> button.
- 7) Adjust the size of the image to match the screen by the zoom lever.
- 8) Adjust the focus again by the focus lever.
- 9) Adjust the size of the image to match the screen by the zoom lever again.

#### **Note**

• When the projector is switched on for the first time after purchase as well as when [INITIALIZE ALL] in the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu is executed, the [INITIAL SETTING] screen is displayed. Refer to "When the initial setting screen is displayed" (♣ page 45).

## Switching off the projector



- 1) Press the power <७/ |> button.
  - The [POWER OFF] confirmation screen is displayed.



2) Press **♦** to select [OK], and press the **<ENTER>** button.

(Or press the power <७/ |> button again.)

- Projection of the image will stop, and the power indicator <ON(G)/STANDBY(R)> on the projector body lights in orange. (The fan keeps running.)
- 3) Wait until the power indicator <ON(G)/STANDBY(R)> lights or blinks in red.
- 4) Press the <OFF> side of the <MAIN POWER> switch to turn off the power.

#### Note

- Do not switch on the projector and project images immediately after switching off the projector.
   Turning on the power while the lamp is still hot may shorten the life of the lamp.
- For about 90 seconds after the projector is switched off and the luminous lamp cooling is started, the luminous lamp will not light up even if the power is switched on. In such a case, switch on the projector again after the power indicator <ON(G)/STANDBY(R)> lights in red.
- The projector consumes power even when the power <⊍/I> button is pressed and the projector is switched off if the main power of the projector is on.
  - When the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu  $\rightarrow$  [ECO MANAGEMENT]  $\rightarrow$  [STANDBY MODE] is set to [ECO], use of some functions is restricted, but the power consumption during standby can be conserved.

## **Direct power off function**

The projector can be turned off during projection or immediately after the luminous lamp is turned off by setting the <MAIN POWER> switch to <OFF>. In addition, when the projector is mounted on the ceiling or installed in an environment where the <MAIN POWER> switch of the projector cannot be easily turned <OFF>, the power can be turned off directly using the circuit breaker. It is also safe in case a power outage occurs or the power cord is pulled out immediately after the projector is switched off.

## **Attention**


Do not set the <MAIN POWER> switch to <OFF> or turn off the power breaker switch in a short time (about 1 minute) after the lamp is lit.
 Doing so may cause the lamp fail to light while you powering on the projector next time, or result in premature deterioration of the lamp.

- If the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu → [INITIAL STARTUP] is set to [LAST MEMORY] and the projector was turned off by using the circuit
  breaker directly while projecting during the last time of use, the power indicator <ON(G)/STANDBY(R)> will light in green a while after the
  circuit breaker is turned on, and then projection of the image will start.
- If the projector is cooled with the direct power off function, it may take longer than usual to be ready for projection when the projector is switched on the next time.

# **Projecting**

Check the external device connection (→ page 38), power cord connection (→ page 43), and switch on the projector (→ page 44) to start projecting. Select the image for projection, and adjust appearance of the projected image.

## Selecting the input signal



The input for projection can be switched. Method to switch the input is as follows.

- Press the input selection buttons on the remote control and directly specify the input to project.
- Press the <INPUT SELECT> button on the control panel to display the input selection screen and select the input to project from the list.

## Switching the input directly via remote control

The input for projection can be switched directly by pressing the input selection button on the remote control.

- 1) Press the input selection (<HDMI1>, <HDMI2>, <DIGITAL LINK>, <COMPUTER1/2>\*1, <VIDEO>, <NETWORK>) buttons.
  - Switches the input, the input guide of the selected input terminal displayed on the top right of the projection screen.

<hdmi1></hdmi1>	Switches the input to HDMI1. The image of the signal being input in the <hdmi 1="" in=""> terminal is projected.</hdmi>
<hdmi2></hdmi2>	Switches the input to HDMI2. The image of the signal being input in the <hdmi 2="" in=""> terminal is projected.</hdmi>

#### **Attention**

- Images may not be projected properly depending on the external device, or the Blu-ray disc or DVD disc, to be played back. Set the [PICTURE] menu → [RGB/YC<sub>B</sub>C<sub>R</sub>]/[RGB/YP<sub>B</sub>P<sub>R</sub>]. (→ page 67)
- Confirm the aspect ratio of the projection screen and the image, and switch to an optimum aspect ratio from the [POSITION] menu →
  [ASPECT]. (→ page 75)

- When the optional DIGITAL LINK output supported device (Model No.: ET-YFB100G, ET-YFB200G) is connected to the <DIGITAL LINK/ LAN> terminal, the input on the DIGITAL LINK output supported device changes each time the <DIGITAL LINK> button is pressed. The input can also be changed using the RS-232C control command.
  - For twisted-pair-cable transmitters of other manufacturers, switch the input on the projector to DIGITAL LINK, and then switch the input on the twisted-pair-cable transmitter.
- Configure [COMPUTER1 INPUT SETTING] of the [DISPLAY OPTION] menu → [COMPUTER IN/OUT] (→ page 79) to match the signal
  to be input to the <COMPUTER 1 IN> terminal.
- If input signal to the <COMPUTER 2 IN/1 OUT> terminal, please set [COMPUTER2 IN] of the [DISPLAY OPTION] menu → [COMPUTER IN/OUT] → [COMPUTER2 SELECT].

## Switching the input by displaying the input guide


The input for projection can be selected by displaying the input guide with the control panel.

#### 1) Press the <INPUT SELECT> button on the control panel.

• The [DETAILED] input guide or the [SIMPLE] input guide is displayed. (→ page 78)

#### 2) Press the <INPUT SELECT> button again.

- The input will switch each time you press the <INPUT SELECT> button.
- You can also select the input source by pressing ▲▼◀▶ on the remote control or the control panel from the [DETAILED] input guide.

If there is no signal input ([COMPUTER1], [COMPUTER2], [HDMI1] or [HDMI2]), this screen will be displayed. Check the output settings of your computer.

#### Note

The input guide for [DETAILED]/[SIMPLE], you can change the setting from the [DISPLAY OPTION] menu → [ON-SCREEN DISPLAY] → [INPUT GUIDE].

## Adjusting the image

Adjust the position, size and focus of the projected image.





#### 1) Adjust the projection angle.

- Install the projector on a horizontal location as the front surface of the projector is parallel to the screen surface so that the projected screen is rectangular.
- If the screen is tilted downward, extend the adjustable feet and adjust the projection screen so that the projected screen is rectangular.
- Refer to "Adjusting adjustable feet" (→ page 37) for details.

#### 2) Release the lens shift lever lock by turning it counter-clockwise.




Fig. 1 Screen display position after the button operation

#### 3) Adjust the lens shift. (Fig. 1)

- Adjust the projection position by using the lens shift lever.
- Refer to "Adjustment range by the lens position shift (optical axis shift)" (▶ page 51) for details.

#### 4) Lock the lens shift lever by turning it clockwise.

#### 5) Adjust the zoom and focus. (Fig. 2)

- Adjust the projected image size by turning the zoom lever.
- Adjust the focus by turning the focus lever.

#### Note


• It is recommended that images be projected continuously for at least 30 minutes before the focus is adjusted.

## Chapter 3 Basic Operations — Projecting

- Turning the focus lever changes the projection screen size. Make fine adjustments again to the projection screen size by turning the zoom lever.
- When there is distortion, execute the [POSITION] menu  $\rightarrow$  [SCREEN ADJUSTMENT].

## Adjustment range by the lens position shift (optical axis shift)

Based on the standard projection position using the optical axis shift function, the projection position can be adjusted in the range shown in the following figures.



#### Note

• The best image can be achieved by installing the projector in front of the screen and adjusting the lens shift lever towards the center.

# Operating with the remote control



## **Using the AV mute function**

If the projector is not used for a certain period of time during the meeting intermission, for example, it is possible to turn off the image and the audio temporarily.



#### **button**

- 1) Press the <AV MUTE> button.
  - The image and the audio disappear.
  - This operation can be also performed by using the <AV MUTE> button on the control panel.
- 2) Press the <AV MUTE> button again.
  - The image and the audio reappear.

#### **Attention**

When the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu → [ECO MANAGEMENT] → [AV MUTE DETECTION] is set to [ON], do not switch on/off in a short time.

## Using the mute function

Audio can be temporarily turned off.



## button

- 1) Press the <MUTE> button.
  - The audio disappears.
- 2) Press the <MUTE> button again.
  - The audio reappears.

## Adjusting the volume

The volume of the built-in speaker or audio output can be adjusted.





button

1) Press the <VOL-> button/<VOL+> button.

52 - ENGLISH

<vol-></vol->	Decreases the volume.
<vol+></vol+>	Increases the volume.

#### **Note**

• This operation can be also performed by using the <VOL-> button/<VOL+> button on the control panel.

## Using the freeze function

The projected image can be paused and the audio turned off regardless of the playback of the external device.



#### button

- 1) Press the <FREEZE> button.
  - The image freezes and the audio disappears.
- 2) Press the <FREEZE> button again.
  - Freezing of the image is canceled and the audio reappears.

#### Note

- [FREEZE] is displayed on the screen when video is paused.
- When no signal input, [KEY NOT APPLICABLE] message will appear.

## Using the on-screen display function

Turn off the on-screen display function (no display) when you do not wish the viewers to see the on-screen display, such as the menu or the input terminal name.



- 1) Press the <ON SCREEN> button.
  - The on-screen display disappears.
- 2) Press the <ON SCREEN> button again.
  - The on-screen display appears.

#### Note

If you press the <MENU> button on the control panel for at least three seconds while the on-screen display is off (hidden), the [OSD] individual adjustment screen is displayed. Press ◀▶ to select [ON], then the on-screen display is turned on.

## Using the automatic setup function

The automatic setup function can be used to automatically adjust the resolution, clock phase, and image position when analog RGB signals consisting of bitmap images such as computer signals are being input. Supplying images with bright white borders at the edges and high-contrast black and white characters is recommended when the system is in automatic adjustment mode. Avoid supplying images that include halftones or gradation, such as photographs and computer graphics.



#### button

## 1) Press the <AUTO SETUP> button.

- The clock phase may shift even if it has completed without any incident. In such cases, adjust the [POSITION] menu → [CLOCK PHASE]
   (⇒ page 75).
- Automatic adjustment may not work depending on the model of the computer and the input signal. And, it may not work properly when the
  input signal is a blurred-edge image or a dark image.
- Images may be disrupted for a few seconds during automatic adjustment, but it is not a malfunction.
- Adjustment is required for each input signal.
- Automatic adjustment can be canceled by pressing the <MENU> button during the automatic adjustment operation.

## Chapter 3 Basic Operations — Operating with the remote control

 If the automatic setup function is used while moving images are being input, the adjustment may not be performed properly even for an RGB signal that can use automatic setup.

## Using the SCREEN ADJ button

The [SCREEN ADJUSTMENT] screen can be displayed.

You can correct the distortion of the projected image that occurs when the projector is installed tilted or when the screen is tilted or curved.



#### button

1) Press the <SCREEN ADJ> button to display [KEYSTONE] individual adjustment screen.

Or press the <SCREEN ADJ> button again to display [CORNER CORRECTION] individual adjustment screen.

Or press the <SCREEN ADJ> button again to display [CURVED CORRECTION] individual adjustment screen.

• If you have adjusted values in any of the individual adjustment screen, the individual adjustment screen is not switched to the next screen even if you press the <SCREEN ADJ> button.

<b>[KEYSTONE]</b> Adjusts when the trapezoid of the projected image is distorted.		
[CORNER CORRECTION] Adjusts when the four corners of the projected image are distorted.		
[CURVED CORRECTION] Adjusts when the linearity is not uniform or the projected image is curved distortion.		

- 2) Press <ENTER> button to select an item.
  - The items will switch each time you press the button.
- Press ▲▼◀▶ to adjust the value.

#### Note

- One of [KEYSTONE], [CORNER CORRECTION] and [CURVED CORRECTION] setting value is valid.
- For more details, refer to the [POSITION] menu → [SCREEN ADJUSTMENT]. (→ page 68)

## Switching the aspect ratio of the image

You can switch aspect ratios according to the input signal.



## button

- 1) Press the <ASPECT> button.
  - The setting will change each time you press the button.

#### **Note**

Refer to the [POSITION] menu → [ASPECT] (→ page 75) for details.

## Using the digital zoom function

(Only for still image-based RGB signals/still image-based HDMI signals/still image-based DIGITAL LINK signals input)

You can enlarge images. You can also change the location of the images to be enlarged.



## **buttons**

1) Press the <D.ZOOM -> button/<D.ZOOM +> button.

- The moving screen is displayed when executing the remote control operation, and the **[DIGITAL ZOOM]** individual adjustment screen is not displayed.
- The [DIGITAL ZOOM] individual adjustment screen is displayed when executing the menu operation. For details, refer to [DISPLAY OPTION] → [OTHER FUNCTIONS]. (→ page 87)

#### 2) Press the following buttons to move the location of the image or adjust the magnification.

 The digital zoom function is canceled if the <D.ZOOM -> button/<D.ZOOM +> is pressed for three seconds or more.

#### Note

- The magnification is not displayed in the moving screen.
- The digital zoom function is canceled if the input signal changes during a digital zoom.
- During a digital zoom, the freeze function is disabled.
- The digital zoom function may not work properly for some still image-based signals.

## Using the presentation timer function

The presentation timer function can be operated.

Presentations, etc. can be performed while checking the elapsed time or time remaining in the preset time.



#### 1) Press the <P-TIMER> button.

- The count is started.
- The elapsed time or the remaining time is displayed at the bottom right of the projected image.

#### 2) Press the <P-TIMER> button again.

• The count is stopped.

#### 3) Press the <P-TIMER> button again.

The count is resumed.

- The presentation timer is ended by holding the <P-TIMER> button down for at least three seconds.
- For details such as presentation timer function settings, refer to [DISPLAY OPTION] menu → [P-TIMER] (→ page 86).

## **Using the FUNCTION button**

Some operations in the menu can be assigned to the <FUNCTION> button on the remote control so that it can be used as an easy shortcut button.



1) Press the <FUNCTION> button.

## To assign functions to the <FUNCTION> button

- Press the <MENU> button on the control panel or the remote control to display the menu items (main menu, sub menu, or details menu) you want to assign.
  - Refer to "Navigating through the menu" (→ page 59) for the operation of the on-screen menu.
- 2) Press and hold the <FUNCTION> button for three seconds or more.

#### Note

- After settings have been completed, the assigned menu item (main menu, sub-menu, or details menu) will be displayed in [ASSIGNED FUNCTION] of the operation guide under the menu.
- Assignment of the function is performed from the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu → [FUNCTION BUTTON] (→ page 93) when deallocating functions.

## Displaying internal test patterns

The projector has ten types of internal test patterns to check the condition of the projector. To display test patterns, perform the following steps.



- 1) Press the <TEST PATTERN> button.
- Press ◀▶ to select the test pattern.

#### Note

- Setting is also available from the [TEST PATTERN] (→ page 95) menu.
- Settings of position, size, and other factors will not be reflected in test patterns. Make sure to display the input signal before performing various adjustments.

## **Using the status function**

You can display the status of the projector.



#### button

- 1) Press the <STATUS> button.
  - The **[STATUS]** screen is displayed.



#### Note

This can be displayed from the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu → [STATUS] (→ page 89).

## **Using the ECO management function**

You can display the setting screen relating to ECO management.



button

1) Press the <ECO> button.

#### Note

Refer to the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu → [ECO MANAGEMENT] (→ page 90) for details.

## Setting the ID number of the remote control

When you use the system with multiple projectors, you can operate all the projectors simultaneously or each projector individually by using single remote control, if unique ID number is assigned to each projector. After setting the ID number of the projector, set the same ID number to the remote control.

The factory default ID number of the projector is set to [ALL]. When using a single projector, press the <ID ALL> button on the remote control. Also, you can control a projector by pressing the <ID ALL> button on the remote control even if you do not know the projector ID.





**buttons** 

- 1) Press the <ID SET> button.
- 2) Within five seconds, press and set the one-digit or two-digit ID number set on the projector using the number (<0> <9>) buttons.
  - If you press the <ID ALL> button, you can control the projectors regardless of the ID number setting of the projector.

#### **Attention**

- Since the ID number of the remote control can be set without the projector, do not press the <ID SET> button on the remote control
  carelessly. If the <ID SET> button is pressed and no number (<0> <9>) buttons are pressed within five seconds, the ID number returns to
  its original value before the <ID SET> button was pressed.
- The ID number set on the remote control will be stored unless it is set again. However, it will be erased if the remote control is left with dead
  batteries. Set the same ID number again when the batteries are replaced.

#### Note

Set the ID number of the projector from the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu → [PROJECTOR ID]. (→ page 89)

# Chapter 4 Settings

This chapter describes the settings and the adjustments you can make using the on-screen menu.

# Menu navigation

The on-screen menu (Menu) is used to perform various settings and adjustments of the projector.

## Navigating through the menu

## Operating procedure



- 1) Press the <MENU> button on the remote control or the control panel.
  - The main menu screen appears.




- 2) Press ▲▼ to select an item from the main menu.
  - The selected item is highlighted in yellow.



- 3) Press the <ENTER> button.
  - The sub-menu items of the selected main menu are displayed.



- 4) Press ▲▼ to select a sub-menu, and press ◀▶ or the <ENTER> button to change or adjust settings.
  - Some items will switch in order as follows each time you press ◀▶.



• For some items, press ◀▶ to display an individual adjustment screen with a bar scale as shown below.



#### Note

- Pressing the <MENU> button while the menu screen is displayed to return the previous menu. You can operate in the same way by pressing the <RETURN> button.
- Some items may not be adjusted or used for certain signal formats to be input to the projector. The menu items that cannot be adjusted or
  used are shown in gray characters, and they cannot be selected. [DIGITAL CINEMA REALITY] and [FRAME LOCK] may not be displayed
  depending on the input signal.
- · Some items can be adjusted even if signals are not input.
- Individual adjustment screen is cleared automatically if no operation is performed for approximately five seconds.
- For menu items, refer to "Main menu" (→ page 60) and "Sub menu" (→ page 60).

#### Resetting adjustment values to the factory default

If the <DEFAULT> button on the remote control is pressed, the values adjusted in the menu items are restored to the factory default settings.



#### button

1) Press the <DEFAULT> button on the remote control.

#### Note

- You cannot reset all the settings to the factory default at a time.
- To reset all the settings adjusted in the sub-menu item to the factory default at a time, execute the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu → [INITIALIZE ALL]. (→ page 99)
- Some items cannot be reset by pressing the <DEFAULT> button. Adjust each item manually.







#### Chapter 4 Settings — [POSITION] menu

[V FIT]	Displays the height of the panel pixels vertically without changing the aspect ratio when wide-screen signals are input. When signals have the aspect ratio horizontally longer than the aspect ratio of the screen, the images are displayed with the right and the left parts cut off.
[FULL]	The image is projected using all the panel (screen) pixels. The input signals are converted to the aspect ratio of the panel (screen).
[NATIVE]	Displays images without changing the resolution of the input signals.

- \*1 Only for video signal (NTSC) input
- \*2 Standard signals are input signals with an aspect ratio of 4:3 or 5:4.
- \*3 Wide-screen signals are input signals with an aspect ratio of 16:10, 16:9 or 15:9.

#### **Note**

- The image size may be switched abnormally when [AUTO] is selected, please set to [NORMAL] or [WIDE] according to the input signal.
- Some size modes are not available for certain types of input signals.
- If an aspect ratio which is different from the aspect ratio for the input signals is selected, the images will appear differently from the originals.
   Be careful of this when selecting the aspect ratio.
- If using the projector in places such as cafes or hotels to display programs for a commercial purpose or for public presentation, note that
  adjusting the aspect ratio or using the zoom function to change the screen images may be an infringement of the rights of the original
  copyright owner for that program under copyright protection laws. Take care when using a function of the projector such as the aspect ratio
  adjustment and the zoom function.
- If conventional (normal) 4:3 images which are not wide-screen images are displayed on a wide screen, the edges of the images may not
  be visible or they may become distorted. Such images should be viewed as with an aspect ratio of 4:3 in the original format intended by the
  creator of the images.

### [FRAME LOCK]

(Only for still image RGB signals input)

This setting is available for specific computer signals. Set when the movie is distorted.

- 1) Press ▲▼ to select [FRAME LOCK].
- 2) Press **♦** or the **<ENTER>** button.
  - The [FRAME LOCK] individual adjustment screen is displayed.
- 3) Press ◆▶ to switch the [FRAME LOCK].
  - The items will switch each time you press the button.

[ON]	Enables the frame lock.
[OFF]	Disables the frame lock.

### [CLAMP POSITION]

You can adjust the optimal point when the black part of the image is blunt or it has turned green.

- Press ▲▼ to select [CLAMP POSITION].
- 2) Press **♦** to adjust.

Status	Rough guide for optimal value	Range of adjustment
The black part is blunt.	The point where bluntness of the black part improves the most is the optimal value.	4 255
The black part is green.	The point where the green part becomes black, and the bluntness has improved is the optimal value.	1 ~ 255

#### **Note**

- [CLAMP POSITION] can be adjusted only when a signal is input to the <COMPUTER 1 IN> terminal or the <COMPUTER 2 IN/1 OUT>
  terminal.
- Some signals may not be adjusted.

# [LANGUAGE] menu

On the menu screen, select [LANGUAGE] from the main menu, and display the sub-menu. Refer to "Navigating through the menu" (→ page 59) for the operation of the menu screen.

### Changing the display language

You can select the language of the on-screen display.

- Various menus, settings, adjustment screens, control button names, etc., are displayed in the selected language.
- The language can be changed to English, German, French, Italian, Spanish, Portuguese, Dutch, Swedish, Finnish, Norwegian, Danish, Polish, Hungarian, Romanian, Czech, Russian, Turkish, Arabic, Kazakh, Vietnamese, Chinese, Korean, Japanese and Thai.

#### Note

 The on-screen display language of the projector is set to English by default and when [INITIALIZE ALL] (→ page 99) in [PROJECTOR SETUP] is executed.

### [WARNING MESSAGE]

Set the display/hide of the warning message.

Set to match the signal to input to the <COMPUTER 1 IN> terminal and the <COMPUTER 2 IN/1 OUT> terminal.

The **[PASSWORD]** screen is displayed when turning the <MAIN POWER> switch to <OFF> and turning on the power. When the entered password is incorrect, the operation will be restricted to the power <\u00f3/|> button on the control panel and on the remote control.

- 1) Press ▲▼ to select [PASSWORD].
- 2) Press **♦** to switch the item.
  - The items will switch each time you press the button.

[OFF]	Disables the security password entry.	
[ON]	Enables the security password entry.	

#### Note

- The [PASSWORD] setting is set to [OFF] by the factory default or when [INITIALIZE ALL] in [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu (→ page 99) is
  executed.
- · Change the password periodically that is hard to guess.
- The security password is enabled after setting [PASSWORD] to [ON] and turning the <MAIN POWER> switch to <OFF>.

# **Chapter 5 Operation of Function**

This chapter describes the operation methods of some functions.

## **Network connections**

This projector has network function that allows the following by connecting a computer. The wireless module (Model No.: ET-WML100) of the optional accessories is required if the wireless LAN is connected.

#### WEB control

By accessing the projector from a computer, you can perform setting, adjustment, status display, etc. of the projector. Refer to "Web control function" (> page 115) for details.

### • Multi Monitoring & Control Software

This software allows you to monitor and control multiple displays (projector or flat panel display) connected to the LAN. For details, please refer to the operating instructions for "Multi Monitoring & Control Software" included in the supplied CD-ROM.

#### Early Warning Software

The projector supports "Early Warning Software", which monitors the status of the display (projector or flat panel display) and the peripheral devices inside an intranet, and notifies of abnormality of such equipment and detects signs of possible abnormality. For details, please visit the website (https://panasonic.net/cns/projector/pass/).

#### • Presenter Light

By using image transfer application software "Presenter Light" that supports Windows computers, you can transfer images and audio to the projector via the wired LAN/wireless LAN. For details, please refer to the operating instructions for "Presenter Light" included in the supplied CD-ROM.

#### VueMagic

By using still image transfer application software "VueMagic", you can transfer images to the projector when iPad/iPhone/iPod touch or Android terminals are connected to this projector through the wireless LAN. Refer to "About VueMagic" ( $\Rightarrow$  page 114) for details.

#### • PJLink


By using PJLink protocol, you can send inquiries about the operations or status of the projector from a computer. Refer to "PJLink protocol" (page 143) for details.

### When connecting via wired LAN

The projector is equipped with a normal <LAN> terminal and a <DIGITAL LINK/LAN> terminal that can receive Ethernet signals from a twisted-pair-cable transmitter together with video and audio signals via a LAN cable.

- When you do not need to connect a twisted-pair-cable transmitter, connect to the <LAN> terminal or the <DIGITAL LINK/LAN> terminal.
- When you need to connect a twisted-pair-cable transmitter that does not support Ethernet signals, connect to the <LAN> terminal.
- When you need to receive Ethernet signals from a twisted-pair-cable transmitter, connect to the <DIGITAL LINK/LAN> terminal.

• When a LAN cable is directly connected to the projector, the network connection must be made indoors.



### Chapter 5 Operation of Function — Network connections

- When a LAN cable is used to transmit and receive Ethernet signal, please connect it to the <LAN> terminal or the <DIGITAL LINK/LINK> terminal of the projector.
- Use a LAN cable that is straight cable or cross cable and compatible with CAT5 or higher. When you need to know whether to use one or both straight/cross cable depending on the configuration of the system, please confirm with your network administrator. For this projector, it will identify the type of cable (straight/cross) automatically.
- Use a LAN cable with length of 100 m (328'1") or shorter.

### Example of network connections via a twisted-pair-cable transmitter



#### **Attention**

When a LAN cable is directly connected to the projector, the network connection must be made indoors.

#### Note

- For the LAN cable between a twisted-pair-cable transmitter and the projector, use a cable that meets the following criteria:
  - Compatible with CAT5e or higher
  - Shielded type (including connectors)
  - Straight-through
  - Single wire
- The maximum transmission distance between the twisted-pair-cable transmitter and the projector is 100 m (328'1"). It is possible to transmit up to 150 m (492'2") if the twisted-pair-cable transmitter supports the long-reach communication method. However, the signal that the projector can receive is only up to 1080/60p (1 920 x 1 080 dots, dot clock frequency:148.5 MHz) when connected with the long-reach communication method. If this distance is exceeded, image may be disrupted or a malfunction may occur in LAN communication.
- When laying cables between a twisted-pair-cable transmitter and the projector, check that cable characteristics are compatible with CAT5e
  or higher using tools such as a cable tester or cable analyzer.
  - When using a relay connector midway, include it in the measurement.
- Do not use a hub between a twisted-pair-cable transmitter and the projector.
- Do not pull cables forcefully. Also, do not bend or fold cables unnecessarily.
- To reduce the effects of noise as much as possible, stretch out the cables between the twisted-pair-cable transmitter and the projector without any loops.
- Lay the cables between a twisted-pair-cable transmitter and the projector away from other cables, particularly power cables.
- When installing multiple cables, run them side by side along the shortest distance possible without bundling them together.
- After laying the cables, confirm that the value of [SIGNAL QUALITY] in the [NETWORK] menu → [DIGITAL LINK STATUS] is displayed in
  green (indicates normal quality). (→ page 103)
- For twisted-pair-cable transmitter of other manufacturers of which the operation has been verified with the DIGITAL LINK compatible
  projector, refer to website (https://panasonic.net/cns/projector/). Note that the verification for devices of other manufacturers has been made
  for the items set by Panasonic Connect Co., Ltd., and not all the operations have been verified. For operation or performance problems
  caused by the devices of other manufacturers, contact the respective manufacturers.

#### **Projector settings**

- 1) Use the LAN cable (Straight) to connect the projector with computer.
- 2) Turn on the projector.
- 3) Press the <MENU> button to display the [NETWORK] menu, and then select [WIRED LAN], and press the <ENTER> button.
- 4) Set the detailed setup of [WIRED LAN].
  - For details, refer to "WIRED LAN" (→ page 104).







[FAN(REAR)]	Trouble has occurred in the rear fan.
[FAN(POWER)]	Trouble has occurred in the power cooling fan.
[FAN(EXHAUST)]	Trouble has occurred in the exhaust fan.
[INTAKE AIR TEMPERATURE]	The air intake temperature is too high. The projector may be used in an operating environment where the temperature is high, such as near a heating appliance.



This chapter describes methods of inspection when there are problems, maintenance, and replacement of the units.


# Lamp/temperature/filter indicators

### When an indicator lights up

If a problem should occur inside the projector, the lamp indicator <LAMP>, the temperature indicator <TEMP>, and the filter indicator <FILTER> will inform you by lighting or blinking. Check the status of the indicators and remedy the indicated problems as follows.

### <u>Attention</u>

• When switching off the projector to deal with problems, make sure to follow the procedure in "Switching off the projector" (→ page 47).

  projector when the operating environment temperature becomes 35 °C (95 °F) or higher (30 °C (86 °F) or higher when using the projector at
  high altitudes).

### Note

- If the filter indicator <FILTER> is still lit or blinking after taking the preceding measures, ask your dealer for repair.
- If the air filter case is not attached when the projector is switched on, the filter indicator <FILTER> blinks in red.

# Maintenance/replacement

### Before performing maintenance/replacement

- Make sure to turn off the power before maintaining the projector or replacing the unit. (→ page 47)
- When switching off the projector, make sure to follow the procedures in "Switching off the projector"
   (\*) page 47).

### **Maintenance**

#### Outer case

Wipe off dirt and dust with a soft, dry cloth.

- If the dirt is persistent, soak the cloth with water and wring it thoroughly before wiping. Dry off the projector with a dry cloth.
- Do not use benzene, thinner, or rubbing alcohol, other solvents, or household cleaners. Doing so may deteriorate the outer case.
- When using chemically treated dust cloths, follow the instructions written on its packaging.

### Lens front surface

Wipe off dirt and dust from the front surface of the lens with a soft clean cloth.

- Do not use a cloth that is fluffy, dusty, or soaked with oil/water.
- Since the lens is fragile, do not use excessive force when wiping the lens.
- Do not use benzene, thinner or rubbing alcohol, other solvents or household cleaners. Using them may cause
  deterioration of the lens.

#### **Attention**

The lens is made of glass. Impacts or excessive force when wiping may scratch its surface. Handle with care.

#### Air filter unit

This projector is equipped with two air filter units.

- Body side: the main air filter unit
- Air filter cover side: the pre-filter


Perform maintenance of the air filter in the following case.

 The air filter is clogged with dust, causing the filter replacement message to appear on the screen and the filter indicator <FILTER> to light in red.

### **Attention**

- Make sure that the projector is stable, and perform the maintenance in a safe place where the unit will not be damaged even if you drop the
  air filter cover and the air filter unit.
- After replacing the air filter, reset the filter counter.
   Otherwise, "FILTER COUNTER has reached the set time." will appear on screen.

#### Removing the air filter unit





Knob Main filter unit

Turn off the power of the projector and set the <MAIN POWER> switch to <OFF> and disconnect the power plug from the power outlet.

2) Remove the air filter cover (Fig. 1).


- Pull out the air filter cover from the hook of the projector while slightly pushing upward the tabs of the air filter cover and open it in the direction of the arrow in figure.
- When pulling open the air filter cover, be sure to firmly hold the air filter cover with your hand. Opening the air filter cover quickly may result in the cover falling.

### 3) Remove the main filter unit.

- Pull out the main filter unit from the tabs of the projector while slightly pressing the knob at the center of the frame at the connecting terminal side (rear side) inward as shown by the arrow, and remove the main filter unit. (Fig. 2)
- After pulling out the main filter unit, remove foreign objects and dust from the main filter unit compartment and the projector's air intake port if there are any.

#### 4) Remove the pre-filter from the air filter cover.


- Put your finger in the groove (in the following figure) and remove the pre-filter from the claws.
- After removing the pre-filter, please remove foreign objects and dust if there are any on the air filter cover.



### Cleaning the air filter unit

Remove the main filter unit and the pre-filter beforehand according to the previously described procedure in "Removing the air filter unit".

You can wash both the main filter unit and the pre-filter.



### 1) Wash the air filter unit. (Fig. 1)

- i) Soak the air filter unit in cold or warm water and then lightly rinse it.
  - Do not use cleaning tools such as brushes.
  - When rinsing, hold the frame of the main filter unit without putting strong pressure on the filter. Also, please don't put strong pressure on the pre-filter.
- ii) Rinse the air filter unit two or three times by using fresh water each time.
  - Insufficient rinsing may result in odors.

#### 2) Dry the air filter unit. (Fig. 2)

- Let the air filter unit naturally dry off in a well-ventilated place where there is little dust and is not exposed to direct sunlight.
- Do not dry using drying devices such as dryers.
- After the air filter unit is dried, proceed to "Attaching the air filter unit" (→ page 136).


#### Attaching the air filter unit

### 1) Attach the main filter unit to the projector.

- Perform Step 3) in "Removing the air filter unit" in the reverse order.
- Push in the main filter unit securely until it clicks into place.

#### 2) Attach the pre-filter to the air filter cover.

- There is no specification of the front and back for attaching the pre-filter.
- Put the pre-filter into the claws (3 places) on one side of the air filter cover (Fig. 1), and then push each
  portion slowly in the direction of the arrows into the claws (3 places) on the other side (Fig. 2). Please
  make sure that there is no damage or deformation at the contact areas of the pre-filter with the claws when
  attaching it.



### 3) Attach the air filter cover to the projector.

- Perform Step 2) in "Removing the air filter unit" in the reverse order to close the air filter cover, and push in the air filter cover securely until it clicks into place.
- Make sure that the air filter cover is closed tightly.

### **Procedure of [FILTER COUNTER RESET]**

- Connect the power plug, set the <MAIN POWER> switch to <ON>, and press the power button <⊕//>
   on the control panel or on the remote control to turn on the power and start projection.
- Press the <MENU> button to display the main menu, then press ▲▼ to select [PROJECTOR SETUP].
- Press the <ENTER> button.
- Press ▲▼ to select [FILTER COUNTER].
- 5) Press the <ENTER> button.
  - The [FILTER COUNTER] screen is displayed.
- 6) Press ▲▼ to select [FILTER COUNTER RESET].
- 7) Press the <ENTER> button.
  - The [FILTER COUNTER RESET] screen is displayed.
- 8) Press **♦** to select [OK], then press the **<ENTER>** button.
  - The filter usage time is reset.

#### **Attention**

- After washing the air filter unit, dry it thoroughly before attaching it back to the projector. Attaching a wet unit will cause an electric shock or malfunction.
- Do not disassemble the main filter unit.
- Make sure that the main filter unit and the pre-filter are properly attached before using the projector. If they are not attached, the projector will suck in dirt and dust causing a malfunction.
- Do not put anything into the air vents. Doing so may result in malfunction of the projector.

#### Note

- If you use the projector without attaching the main filter unit, the filter indicator <FILTER> blinks in red and the message appears on the
  projected image for approximately 30 seconds.
- Replace the air filter unit with the new optional Replacement Filter Unit (Model No.: ET-RFF200) if it is damaged or if the dirt does not come off even after washing.
- Air filter replacement is recommended after cleaning the unit two times.
- The dust-proof properties may be reduced after each cleaning.
- The replacement cycle of the air filter unit varies greatly depending on the usage environment.

### Replacing the unit

#### Lamp unit

The lamp unit is a consumable component. Refer to "When to replace the lamp unit" (▶ page 137) for details about the replacement cycle.

When purchasing the optional Replacement Lamp Unit (Model No.: ET-LAEF100), consult your dealer. It is recommended that you request a qualified technician to replace the lamp unit. Consult your dealer.

### WARNING

Replace the lamp unit after the lamp has cooled (after waiting at least one hour).

The high temperature inside the cover will cause burns.

### Notes on the replacement of the lamp unit

- Since the luminous lamp is made of glass, it may burst if dropped or hit with a hard object. Handle with care.
- Do not disassemble or modify the lamp unit.
- When replacing the lamp unit, be sure to hold it by the handle because its surface is pointed and its shape is protruded.
- The lamp may rapture. Replace the lamp unit carefully so that the glass fragments of the lamp do not scatter.
   While attaching the projector to the ceiling, do not work right under the lamp unit or do not conduct work while your face is near the lamp unit.
- The lamp contains mercury. When disposing of used lamp units, contact your local authorities or dealer for correct methods of disposal.

### **Attention**

 Panasonic Connect Co., Ltd. takes no responsibility for any damage or malfunction of the product resulting from use of lamp units which are not manufactured by Panasonic Connect Co., Ltd. Use only specified lamp units.

#### Note

- The model numbers of accessories and optional accessories are subject to change without prior notice.
- A Phillips screwdriver is necessary when replacing the lamp unit.

### When to replace the lamp unit

The lamp unit is a consumable component. Since its brightness gradually decreases over time, it is necessary to replace the lamp unit regularly.

Time for replacement

When [LAMP POWER] is constantly set to [NORMAL] without switching to other modes = 6 000 hours When [LAMP POWER] is constantly set to [ECO] without switching to other modes = 8 000 hours but the lamp may go off before the time above mentioned has elapsed depending on individual lamp characteristics, usage conditions, and the installation environment. It is recommended that the Replacement lamp unit be prepared earlier.

In order to predict the lamp replacement time, please refer to the lamp runtime displayed in [STATUS]  $(\Rightarrow page 89) \rightarrow [RUNTIME] \rightarrow [LAMP] \rightarrow [NORMAL]/[ECO]$ . It also can be obtained by using the following formula. (The time which is displayed in [ECO] is the converted usage time when set to [NORMAL].)

Formula for lamp replacement time (rough estimate) = "Lamp runtime of [NORMAL]" + "Lamp runtime of [ECO]" × 3/4

If the time which is obtained by the above equation 6 000 hours has elapsed, the lamp turns off automatically after approximately 10 minutes, as it will cause malfunction of the projector.


#### **Note**

 The time which is obtained by the formula for lamp replacement time "6 000 hours" is a rough guideline, but is not a guarantee. The lamp runtime differs depending on the setting of "LAMP POWER" menu.

#### How to replace the lamp unit

#### **Attention**

- While attaching the projector to the ceiling, do not work right under the lamp unit or do not conduct work while your face is near the lamp unit
- Do not remove or loosen the screws other than specified ones when replacing the lamp unit.
- Make sure to attach the lamp unit and the lamp cover securely.



### Turn off the power of the projector and set the <MAIN POWER> switch to <OFF> and disconnect the power plug from the power outlet.

• Wait at least one hour and check if the lamp unit has cooled down.

#### 2) Remove the lamp cover. (Fig. 1)

- Use a Phillips screwdriver to turn the lamp cover fixing screw (x1) counterclockwise until it turns freely, and slide and pull up the lamp cover slowly in the direction of the arrow to remove it.
- Opening the lamp cover quickly may result in falling.

#### 3) Remove the lamp unit. (Fig. 2)

- Use a Phillips screwdriver to turn the lamp unit fixing screws (x3) counterclockwise until they turn freely, and remove the lamp unit.
- Hold the handles of the lamp unit and remove it straight.

#### 4) Push in the new lamp unit while paying attention to the insertion position.

• If the lamp unit is not installed properly, remove it and then push it in slowly. Pushing it in quickly or forcibly may break the connector.

#### 5) Use a Phillips screwdriver to firmly tighten the lamp unit fixing screws (x3).

• Make sure to attach the lamp unit securely.

### 6) Attach the lamp cover.

- i) Perform Step 2) in the reverse order to attach the lamp cover.
- ii) Use a Phillips screwdriver to firmly tighten the lamp cover fixing screw (x1).
  - Make sure to attach the lamp cover slowly and securely.

#### **Note**

· When you replace the lamp unit with new one, the projector resets the runtime of the lamp unit automatically.

#### Air filter unit

When the dust remains after cleaning, it is time to replace the air filter.

The Replacement Filter Unit (Model No.: ET-RFF200) is an optional accessory. To purchase the product, consult your dealer.

#### How to replace the air filter unit

#### **Attention**

- Make sure that the projector is stable, and perform the replacement in a safe place where the unit will not be damaged even if you drop the air filter cover or the air filter unit.
- 1) Turn off the power of the projector and set the <MAIN POWER> switch to <OFF> and disconnect the power plug from the power outlet.
- 2) Remove the air filter cover.
  - Step 2) ~ step 4), refer to "Removing the air filter unit" (→ page 134).
- Remove the main filter unit.
- 4) Remove the pre-filter from the air filter cover.
- 5) Attach the main filter unit of the optional Replacement Filter Unit (Model No.: ET-RFF200) to the projector.
  - Step 5) ~ step 7), refer to "Attaching the air filter unit" (→ page 136).
- 6) Attach the pre-filter of the optional Replacement Filter Unit (Model No.: ET-RFF200) to the air filter cover.
- 7) Attach the air filter cover to the projector.
- 8) Execute the [FILTER COUNTER RESET].
  - Refer to "Procedure of [FILTER COUNTER RESET]" (→ page 136).

#### **Attention**

• When using the projector, be sure to attach the air filter unit. If it is not attached, the projector will suck in dirt and dust which may cause a malfunction. The air filter unit to replace the old one should be an unused product.

### Note

If you use the projector without attaching the air filter unit, the message appears on the projected image for approximately 30 seconds.
